**Today we mark a Sunday for Truth and Reconciliation**, a day after National "Orange Shirt Day", which remembers the atrocities carried out in the Indigenous Residential School system, and the calls to action articulated by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.


Today is a day to denounce the falsehood of the Doctrine of Discovery, that stated that prior to colonialism, there was no one on these lands, or at least nobody of human value.

This lie carried over into enforced assimilation of language and culture of the Indigenous Peoples, with terrible consequences that continue to this day.

In our Reading from Philippians this morning, Paul urges us to look to Christ as a model of humility, putting the interests of others above our own.

This model of true servanthood and a posture of respect and listening offers a path toward reconciliation between settlers, their descendants and First Nations.
