
General Announcements

Our annual **Advent Carol Service** takes place on Sunday, December 3, 2023 at 7 pm. The Sanctuary Choir will be joined by guest artist Lori Gemmell, harpist with the former Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony, to present selections from Benjamin Britten's A Ceremony of Carols.

Lori Gemmell joined the former Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony in 1999 and was principal harpist with the KWS when it ceased to operate in September 2023. She received her Master's degree from the University of Toronto where she studied with renowned Canadian harpist Judy Loman. Lori is much in demand as a soloist, chamber musician and recording artist and is a harp instructor with the Wilfrid Laurier University music faculty.

West Tower Door for Emergency Only. Due to the ongoing construction planning, when going in to the church house or washrooms, use the west stair tower door and stay on that floor. Use the hallway by the office to the stairway to the floor below. The stairs in the west tower are closed to the lower level sanctuary and should only be used in case of an emergency to exit the building.

Fire Exits: All Sanctuary fire exits remain operational during lower-level demolition and renovations. This includes the three Narthex (Entrance) doors, the mid-tower door (half-way up the right side), and the staircase at the front left, piano side.
